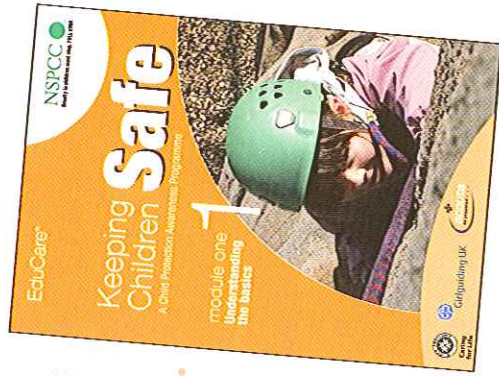


How do I register for the programme?

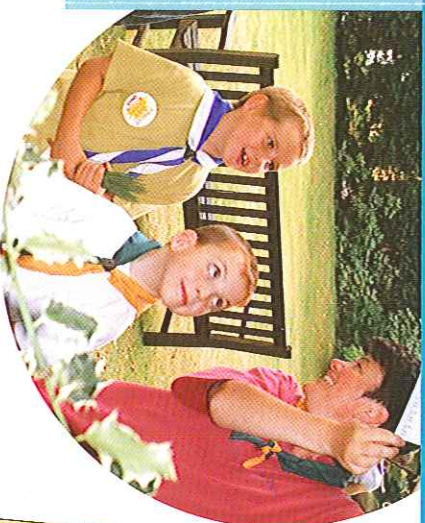

Keeping Children Safe



What is involved?

Keeping Children Safe is designed to make child protection training easily accessible to everyone. There are three short learning modules, which you can choose to receive at home in paper format, or through e-learning via the internet. To complete each of the modules, you simply read the text and return the multiple-choice questionnaire and submit for marking. On completion of the programme successful participants gain a personalised certificate from the NSPCC.

Once you have completed the programme you will:

- be making an important contribution to protecting children **and** yourself
- be aware of your role in child protection
- Feel more confident to act should you have concerns about a child
- be able to demonstrate to others that you have completed a formal programme on child protection awareness.

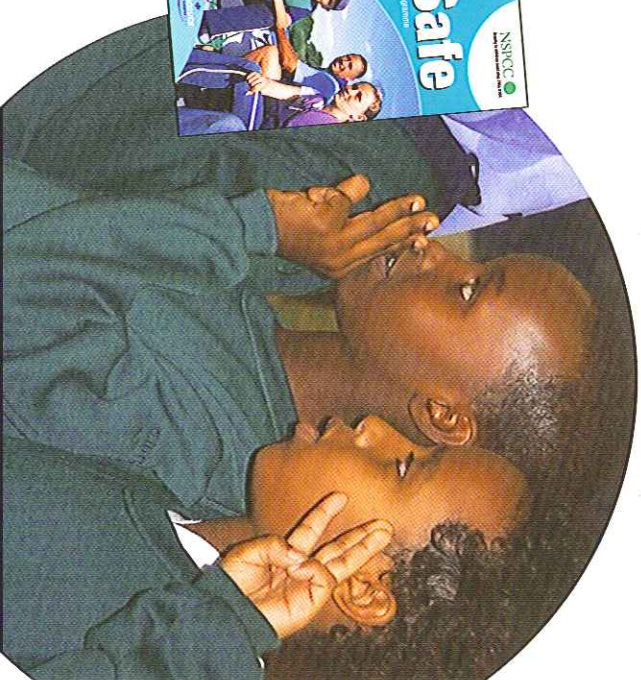

Keeping Children Safe is designed for any adult who comes into contact with children through their work or leisure activities.

This short programme works by helping individuals to understand the unique role they play in keeping children safe from harm.
