Welcome to



Guides is all about fun, learning and making things happen.

Guides is for girls aged 10-14. Guides get involved in planning everything they do such as adventurous activities and exploring new places, helping the community and learning skills for life.

What do Guides need?

Guides don't need anything in particular to get started - as long as they're in sensible clothes and shoes (think fun and active) then they can join in straight away. Your daughter's Guide leader will talk to you in the first few weeks to organise things like uniform, once your new daughter has settled in.

Girlguiding produces everything you'll need - comfy Guide uniform, a Guide handbook (which tells your daughter all about being a Guide), and a range of Guide accessories and resources to help her feel at home in guiding. You can buy these online at girlguidingshop.co.uk, from our Guiding Essentials catalogue or from our local volunteer-run shops. Only if you buy directly from us can you be sure that 100% of profits stay in guiding, enabling us to offer life-changing opportunities to even more girls and young women.

If you have any questions about what your daughter needs to get started in Guides, please speak to your daughter's leader.

What does it cost to be a Guide?

All Girlguiding groups (also called 'units') charge subscriptions or 'subs' to cover the costs of equipment, activities and hiring the meeting place. These can be paid weekly, monthly or each term. There's also an annual subscription paid by all members that covers the day-to-day running of our charity and your local guiding area. This is sometimes included in subs.

Because all Girlguiding units are different, and do so many different things, costs can vary. Your daughter's Guide leader will let you know the costs for your unit and when these can be paid. There's usually an extra charge for special activities, days out, residential events and holidays. Your daughter's unit leader will share all the information you need about these in advance so look out for more information.

We try to make guiding affordable for all girls and there's help at hand if you can't meet the costs. If you're concerned about any of these costs, speak to your daughter's unit leader and she can tell you about ways we can help, including our grants.

As Girlguiding is a charity, if you pay income tax we can use Gift Aid to claim 25p for every £1 you give us, including for your daughter's subs. So we'd really appreciate it if you'd sign the Gift Aid form on p7: the extra money will go straight back to your daughter's unit.

Supporting your daughter in Guides

As a parent/carer/guardian you have an important role in making sure your daughter can get the most from her guiding experience. Here's just a few ways you can help:

Taking part

We'll assume you're happy for your Guide to take part in activities at normal meeting time and place, but if we're going off site or doing something more adventurous we may need you to fill in a consent form.

Encourage her to get involved

Bring her along to regular unit meetings and encourage her to take part in special events. There may be times when she can't make it, if so let the unit leader know.

• Look out for important information

Your daughter's leader is a volunteer who's running the unit in her spare time. To support her in organising activities and opportunities for your daughter, look out for information, and then return paperwork (such as consent forms) and make any payments on time. If there's any problems let the leader know as soon as possible.

Keep your information up-to-date

Including things like: contact details, medical conditions, changes in family circumstances, emergency contact details and who'll be dropping off and collecting your daughter from the unit meeting. If things change it's important to let the unit leader know so she can update her records and continue to keep your daughter safe.

Support at home

There will be things for your daughter to try at home, so any support you can give her with these activities will help her to progress in Guides, and earn badges and awards along the way. If you have concerns about the support your daughter might need at home, please speak to your daughter's unit leader.

Moving on from Guides

Once your daughter turns 14 years old, she can continue her Girlguiding journey in The Rangers, for girls aged 14-18. When this time comes, your daughter's Guide leader can tell you everything you need to know and support you and your daughter to make the move.


