Rangers is for young women aged 14-18. Being a Ranger offers a huge variety of opportunities - make new friends, travel abroad, learn new things and get your voice heard on issues that you care about. You can also volunteer with other Girlguiding units in your area.

Volunteer roles include:

Young leader (14-18)

Help girls make the most of their time in Rainbows, Brownies and Guides.

Peer educator

Learn skills to help girls and young women deal with the issues that affect them today.

Advocate

Join Girlguiding's youth panel to discuss the issues that matter to our members - and help to do something about them.

What do Rangers need?

Rangers don't need anything in particular to get started - as long as you wear sensible clothes and shoes (think fun and active) then you'll be able to join in straight away. Your Ranger leader will talk to you in the first few weeks to organise things like uniform, once you've settled in.

Girlguiding produces everything you'll need - comfy Ranger uniform, a Ranger handbook (which tells you all about being a Ranger), as well as Ranger accessories and resources to help you feel at home in guiding. You can buy these online at girlguidingshop.co.uk, from our Guiding Essentials catalogue or from our local volunteer-run shops. Only if you buy directly from us can you be sure that 100% of profits stay in guiding, enabling us to offer life-changing opportunities to even more girls and young women.

If you have any questions about what you need to get started in Rangers, please speak to your leader.

What does it cost to be a Ranger?

All Girlguiding groups (also called 'units') charge subscriptions or 'subs' to cover the costs of equipment, activities and hiring the meeting place. These can be paid weekly, monthly or each term. There's also an annual subscription paid by all members that covers the day-to-day running of our charity and your local guiding area. This is sometimes included in subs.

Because all Girlguiding units are different, and do so many different things, costs can vary. Your leader will let you know the costs for your unit and when these can be paid. There's usually an extra charge for special activities, days out, residential events and holidays. Your leader will share all the information you need about these in advance - so look out for more information.

We try to make guiding affordable for all girls and there's help at hand if you can't meet the costs. If you're concerned about any of these costs, speak to your leader and she can tell you about ways we can help, including our grants.

As Girlguiding is a charity, if you pay income tax we can use Gift Aid to claim 25p for every £1 you give us, including for your subs. So we'd really appreciate it if you'd sign the Gift Aid form on p7: the extra money will go straight back to your unit.

How to make the most of being a Ranger

● Get involved

Try to come along to regular unit meetings and take part in special events. There may be times when you can't make it, if so let your unit leader know.

● Look out for important information

Your leader is a volunteer who's running the unit in her spare time. To support her in organising activities and opportunities for you, look out for information and respond, return paperwork (such as consent forms) and any payments on time. If there's any problems let the leader know as soon as possible.

● Keep your information up-to-date on GO

Including things like: contact details, medical conditions, changes in family circumstances, emergency contact details.

Under 18's: parental permission

If you're under 18, you'll need a parent/carer/guardian to give their permission for you to take part in our activities, both in regular meetings and for outings or other special events. If you have any questions or concerns about this, please speak to your leader.
