

**Are you ready to design your new uniform? We're working with uniform designers, Hemingway Design. They're co-designing the uniform because you, as the wearers, are the experts.**

Over 20,000 Girlguiding girls and volunteers have already told us all about their ideas for the new uniform. There's a lot to think about and we're excited to hear from even more of you.

We're starting off by looking at colours and logo designs. We've used a hoodie design as an example, because they're a great way to keep cosy and warm, which our members told us is important. This doesn't mean that this hoodie is our final choice!

You'll also notice that we're using some new colours in our examples. We know how much the environment matters, so it's important that we think about how to use more natural fabric in your new uniform. For volunteers, this might mean that we need to consider some different colour and fabric options.

**Nothing is decided yet, so we want to know what you think at this stage. The pictures you'll see aren't the final designs, this is just our starting point.**

There are 2 activities for you to take part in. Let's get started!

\* 'Marl' means using different coloured yarns to make 1 single thread. Twisting the colours together can mean that there are small colour differences between garments.

## 1 - Choose your favourite

We've designed a few different hoodies for you to have a look at. They're going to be super cosy and designed together with you!

There's 2 ways we want you to think about the designs. We want to know your personal favourite and which options you think most volunteers would like/want to wear. We want to make sure everyone feels comfortable and proud to wear their new Girlguiding uniform.

**Step 1:** Take a look at all the designs. While your unit is selecting their favourites, take a look at the leader options. Pick your favourite:

- Hoodie colour
- Logo design
- Logo colour

Place a tick in the box on the activity template next to your personal favourite hoodie colour, logo design and logo colour.

**Step 2 (optional):** It's important for us to listen to each other so we can have a uniform that everyone is happy with. If you have time, think about which options you think all leaders would like. You could talk to other volunteers to discuss your thoughts. From the options on the sheet, pick one option that you think everyone would be happy to wear. Circle it on the activity sheet.

Upload your responses to our short survey, along with your unit's results.

## 2-Design your uniform

**Step 1:** It's your time to be in the uniform designing driving seat. We want you to add colour and designs elements (think pockets, zips, thumbholes) to the images of the volunteers. Show us how you want your uniform to look. You can use the hoodie designs to help you.

**Step 2:** Have a think about all the items you would like in your uniform collection. You could include neckers, hats, belts, headbands, somewhere to display your badges - anything you like. Share your designs with us. You can draw or write on the worksheet, or create your own designs on a separate blank sheet of paper.

How many different ways can you think of using a necker? Jot down your ideas around the pictures.
