As a young leader coordinator, you'll support our young leaders and young external volunteers aged 13-17 to grow their leadership skills. You'll help them be fantastic role models to the Rainbows, Brownies and Guides they volunteer with.

This role is a great opportunity to work as part of a team, promoting how amazing being a young leader is and supporting the young leaders in your area.

It's a flexible volunteering opportunity. You don't have to go to weekly unit meetings. But you'll still make a big difference to the lives of our young leaders - and the young members they volunteer with.

Some of what you'll do:

- Mentor young leaders as they grow their skills and have new experiences.
- Develop a local plan to support young leaders and put it into practice.
- Raise awareness of the young leader opportunities in your area.
- Run local meet-ups for young leaders to share their experiences and ideas and have fun together.
- Organise day-long and/or residential training courses so young leaders can grow their skills.
- Keep young leader GO records up to date for your area.
- You'll also support young external volunteers and their leaders
- Safeguarding is at the heart of everything we do. You'll provide a safe, girl-only space where every young leader can discover her full potential. You'll be a safe adult to talk to.

What training and support do you get?

- We'll give you a thorough induction to your role.

You'll need:

To have good communication skills

To be good at planning and coordination
You should be able to make plans and deliver them effectively either on your own or as part of a team.

To be open and approachable
It's important that you can warmly welcome young people, their parents and adult leaders, so you can help them all grow.

You should be enthusiastic about helping girls and young women reach their full potential.

✓ To be aware of safety and safeguarding You should be able to recognise how to do everything the role involves safely, and put this into practice.

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- You'll learn how to coach young people to become confident leaders. This will include helping them to think beyond the box when it comes to what they can do.
- You'll expand your event management skills by putting on training events and meet-ups.
