Future Girl: Meet the Planet Protectors

In 2018, the girls and young women in Girlguiding were asked what they really cared about. We responded in our thousands. And we decided what really matters to us is taking better care of animals and our planet.

We want people to look after the world. We want to see less plastic polluting our oceans and affecting wildlife and to make recycling and reusing things part of everyday life.

Why a DRS?

We know from other countries, like Norway, that a deposit return scheme (DRS) will help reduce plastic pollution. We want a DRS in the UK and to help make it work for everyone.

The future of the planet is our future too and we are part of the solution to end plastic pollution. We have ideas about what a DRS should look like and we want everyone – including the people in charge – to hear what we have to say.

Are you listening?




How plastic littering makes us feel

Top ways to get our money back

Many DRS schemes use coupons, but we don't think this is the best way to get our money back – we'd like to get the cash straight away. We thought there should be an option to donate our deposit to a charity of our choice.




17% said donate it to a charity of their choice

Some of us thought it's okay to pay up to 40p per bottle because we get the money back and we know it's going to help the planet. But we want to make sure everyone can use it and nobody is excluded because of cost.
